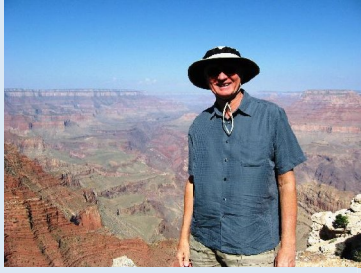


Writing to Save the Places We Love with Page Lambert
